

Turn It Around for Good Series – Workshop Speak It • Decree It • Steward It

Rate Yourself Assessment Instructions:

- Choose the grade that reflects your **current, consistent practice**.
- Review the **correct answer and explanation**.
- Identify **one action** you will take this week to move toward or remain at an **A-level response**.

Reminder: This workshop is not about condemnation. It is about **alignment** and bringing your words, faith, and actions into agreement with God's Word.

1. Voice-Activated Faith

Reminder of what Pastor James & Pastora Karen taught:

“When your words align with God's Words, your miracle begins moving toward you. Your turnaround is voice activated.”

Question: When facing a challenge, do your words consistently align with God's Word or with the circumstances?

Rate Yourself Grade Level Choices:

- A – I consistently speak God's Word first, even when emotions or circumstances disagree.
- B – I eventually speak faith, but only after fear or frustration comes out.
- C – I know what to say, but rarely say it under pressure.
- D – My words usually mirror the problem, not the promise.
- F – I do not believe my words affect outcomes.

Answer = A

Why A Is Correct:

Part 8 teaches that when your words agree with God's Word, you receive miracle. Silence or negative speech can challenge that.

How to achieve or maintain an A grade for your next challenge:

- Decide **in advance** what you will say when a challenge arises.
- Replace first reactions with **scripture-based affirmations**.
- Practice speaking faith-filled words **out loud daily**, not just in emergencies.

2. Speaking Before Seeing

Reminder of what Pastor James & Pastora Karen taught:

The miracle that the woman with the issue of blood received began when she said an affirmation in Luke 7:44, "If only I may touch His clothes, I shall be made well." It was when she was a Doer of God's Word to speak it and she touched the hem of Jesus' garment, she received her completed manifested miracle.

Question: Do you speak your turnaround before there is visible evidence?

Rate Yourself Grade Level Choices:

- **A** – I speak what I believe God has said, regardless of what I see.
- **B** – I speak faith when encouraged by others.
- **C** – I wait for improvement before speaking positively.
- **D** – I want to see the results appear before I believe it.
- **F** – I am afraid of negative circumstances.

Answer = A

Why A Is Correct:

Faith does not wait for evidence. Faith **creates the evidence** by speaking the Word of God first.

How to achieve or maintain an A grade for your next challenge:

- Speak God's promise **first**.
- **Affirm God's Word of Truth** even when nothing seems to have changed yet.
- Speaking negative words can **cancel your prayer**.
- **Seeing the results or the manifestation follows speaking God's Word**, not the other way around.

3. A Decree Activates Your Royal Authority

Reminder of what Pastor James & Pastora Karen taught:

Make your decree using your royal authority. It should be from an attitude of ownership as a Co-heir with Christ Jesus without doubt and fear.

Question: When you make a decree, do you speak from an attitude of ownership as your inherited rights with faith using your godly authority?

Rate Yourself Grade Level Choices:

- **A** – I decree God's Word with confidence that it is my inheritance.
- **B** – I decree and affirm it, but feel unworthy to receive it
- **C** – I decree, but still question whether it will work for me.
- **D** – I decree inconsistently and without authority.
- **F** – I do not make personal decrees.

Answer: A

Why A Is Correct:

A decree is not a wish, it is a **command issued activating your inheritance**. As a Co-heir with Christ Jesus, you are speaking from the heavenly place of what already belongs to you, not from uncertainty.

How to achieve or maintain an A grade for your next challenge:

- Study scriptures that confirm your **identity and inheritance**.
- **Stop** framing decrees as “hopes” or “maybes.”
- Speak as an **heir**, you don’t have to ask for what already belongs to you.

4. Dominion Through Decrees

Reminder of what Pastor James & Pastora Karen taught:

“Your decree announces to the spirit realm that you are taking dominion.”

Question: Do your decrees announce spiritual dominion, or do they sound like requests for permission?

Rate Yourself Grade Level Choices:

- **A** – My decrees clearly reflect authority and spiritual ownership as a Co-heir of Christ Jesus.
- **B** – My decrees are faith-filled but sometimes timid.
- **C** – My decrees sound more like asking for a request rather than making a command.
- **D** – I repeatedly ask God to grant my petition instead of making a commanding decree once and affirm it after.
- **F** – I do not understand or exercise spiritual dominion.

Answer: A

Why A Is Correct:

Decrees declare **dominion**, not desperation. They announce to the spirit realm that you are enforcing the power and dominion that God delegated to you. So you are authorizing that what you need on earth should be done as soon as you decree it.

How to Achieve or Maintain an A Next Time:

- Decree with your godly dominion using the Word of God **only one time**.
- Then **affirm it frequently as thanksgiving to God and a reminder to the devil that it is already yours**.
- **Decree once is standing firm in your faith of who you are as a Co-Heir as a King of Heaven serving Jesus, your King of Kings.**

5. Stewarding the Turnaround

Reminder of what Pastor James & Pastora Karen taught:

A decree is released once. An affirmation is repeated frequently.

Question: After making a decree once, do you steward it with daily affirmations and consistent faith-filled living?

Rate Yourself Grade Level Choices:

- **A** – I made the decree once and consistently do an affirmation to support it as gratitude to God and a reminder to devil of what belongs to me.
- **B** – I say affirmations but inconsistently.
- **C** – I affirm occasionally, mostly during stress.
- **D** – I forget to affirm and return to old thinking.
- **F** – I made a decree but did not steward it.

Answer: A

Why A Is Correct:

Part 10 teaches that **decrees initiate**, but **stewardship sustains**. Daily affirmations creates the turnaround and also sustains it to avoid reversal, old mindsets, fear, and doubt.

How to Achieve or Maintain an A Next Time:

- Schedule daily affirmations just like prayer time.
- Guard your words after the breakthrough.
- Steward with **consistency, gratitude, and obedience**.

- Which question revealed your **next growth area**?
- What will you **change this week** to achieve or maintain an **A-level**?
- Have you **created decrees since last week**?
- Have you **created an affirmation to support that decree** to say frequently?

- Can you create an affirmation to support that decree to say frequently now?

Application of a New Lifestyle:

- **One-Time Decree (Say Once):**
In the Name of Jesus, I release a decree for stewarding my turnaround, declaring that God is bringing me into supernatural acceleration, divine restoration, abundant overflow, supernatural harvests, godly dominion, authority, power, and continuous, never-ceasing miracles according to Amos 9:13–15. Amen.
- **Daily Affirmation (Say Frequently):**
In the Name of Jesus, I affirm that my turnaround is moving me into supernatural acceleration, divine restoration, abundant overflow, supernatural harvests, godly dominion, authority, power, and continuous, never-ceasing miracles according to Amos 9:13–15. Amen.
